Power Macintosh Receives High Honors at Sydney's PC'94 Show

Power Mac voted Best Personal Computer by two leading publications

CUPERTINO, CA--MARCH 22, 1994--

Underscoring the momentum of the recently introduced Power Macintosh line of computers, Apple Computer, Inc. today announced that the Power Macintosh computer has received two awards at the PC 94 Show, recently held in Sydney, Australia.

During Australia's largest business computing show, Apple's next generation of personal computers was named Best Hardware Product by PC Week Magazine, and Best Macintosh Hardware Product by Australian MacUser Magazine. The PC Week award is significant because it is the first time a Macintosh personal computer has been voted Best Hardware Product.

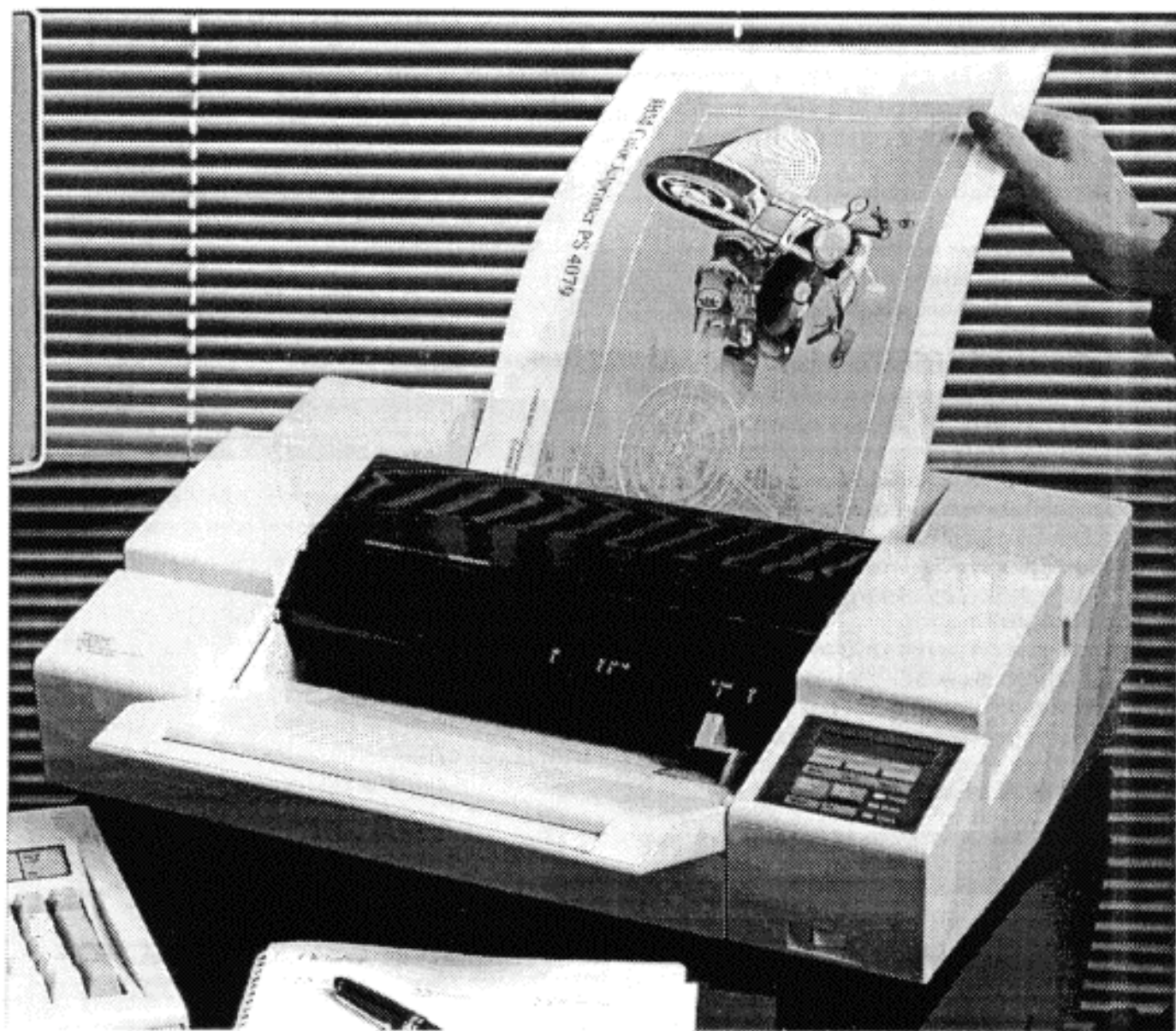

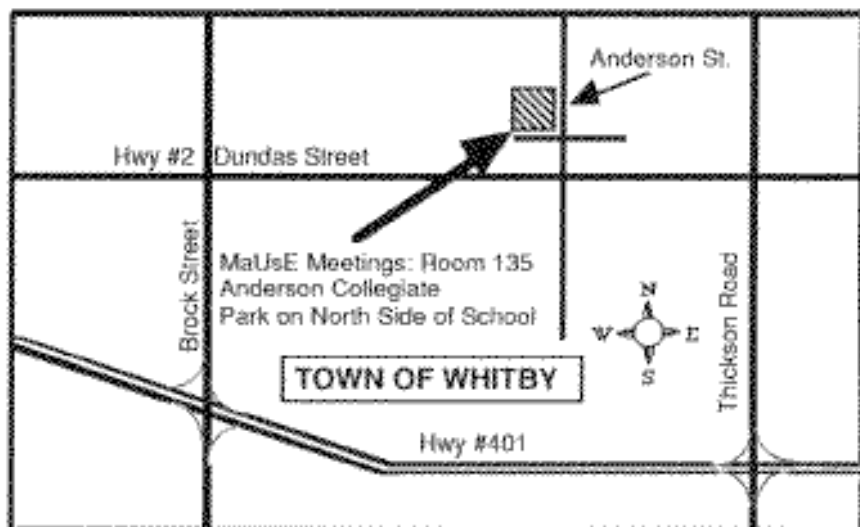

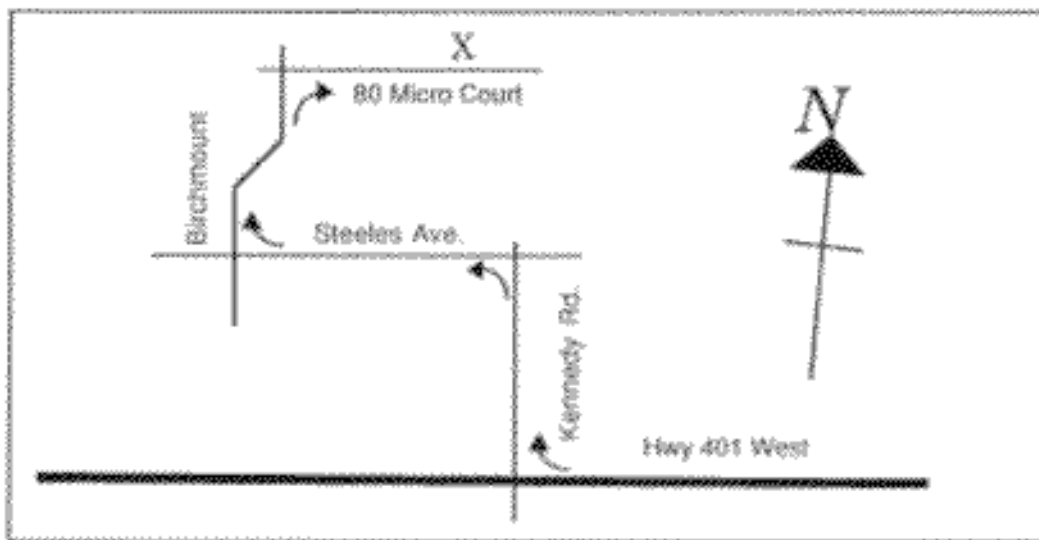
